As public interest in consumer electronics for improving personal health grows, physicians have an important role to play in guiding patients and advocating for evidence to support the use of these technologies in clinical settings.

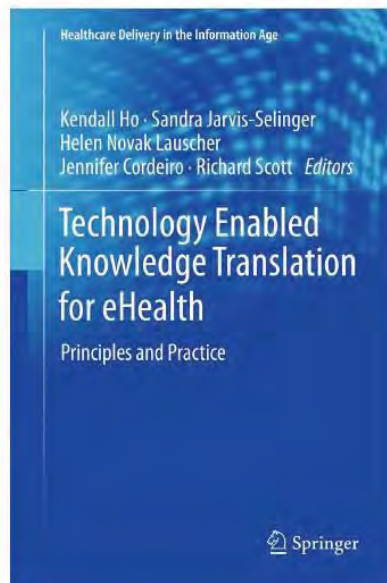
ABSTRACT: The proliferation of mobile technologies that can measure and gather a variety of data has increased public interest in using consumer electronics to take ownership of personal health and wellness. Apps, wearables, and sensors can unobtrusively gauge physiological and emotional states and collect, quantify, and monitor data regarding a user's day-to-day behaviors, can provide timely and patient-centred care to those living at a distance with chronic disease, and can be used to coordinate care when multiple providers are involved, reducing costs to the health care system. In all cases, merely tracking data is not enough to maintain health behaviors long-term, and the software must also incorporate motivational constructs important for the adoption and habituation of health-related behaviors. Even though all of these technologies are promising, it is important to identify possible risks, from physiological harm to privacy concerns, and to understand the challenges of how to mitigate any risks. Before recommending technologies themselves so they understand the challenges of these evolutionary times, guiding patients, advocating for evidence, and supporting the development and incorporation of technology into clinical practice are key roles for physicians.
