1. What is happening?

Michael Smith Health Research BC is sunsetting its instance of REDCap and will stop providing REDCap services in spring 2025.

2. Why is REDCap being transitioned?

This instance of REDCap is supported by a grant that ends in 2027. This allows time to safely move existing projects to a new host before grant funding ends.

3. When will the transition take place?

Projects will be temporarily hosted by the BC Children's Hospital Research Institute (BCCHR). The transition from Health Research BC to BCCHR will take place in the fall of 2024. BCCHR will work with teams to assess each project's needs. Where appropriate, BCCHR will transfer existing active projects to a new host institution.

4. Who will be affected?

Teams with existing projects will be supported to navigate any changes as a result of the transition. The BCCHR Data Management Team are planning and implementing this change.

5. What do I need to do?

If you are part of a team with an existing project on our REDCap instance, you will receive an email with details about the transition of your project.

6. How will Health Research BC and BCCHR help?

We are available to help teams through this transition. Contact redcap@healthresearchbc.ca for support.

7. What will change during the transition to BCCHR?

Health Research BC's instance of REDCap will be temporarily hosted by BCCHR. This will mean changes to the web address and contact email. In addition, BCCHR will manage your user account. You may need to update your project's research ethics documentation to reflect these changes.
